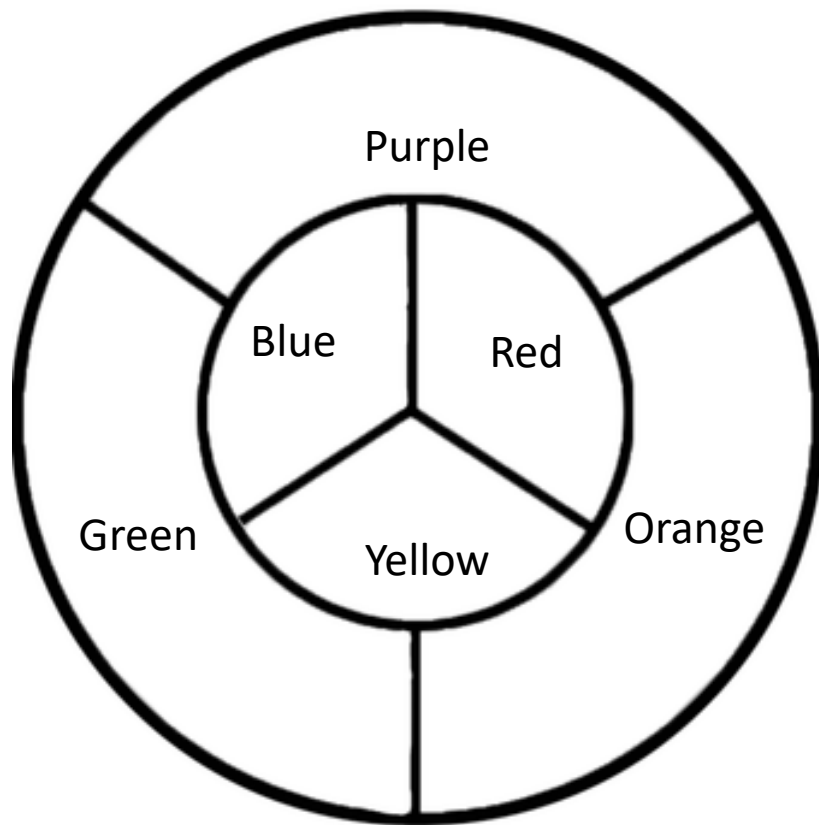

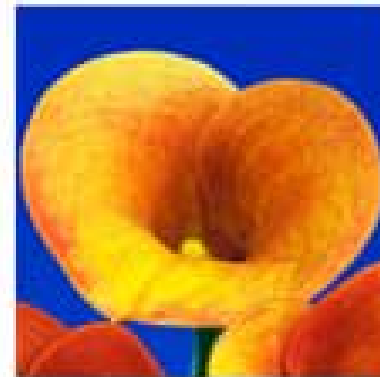
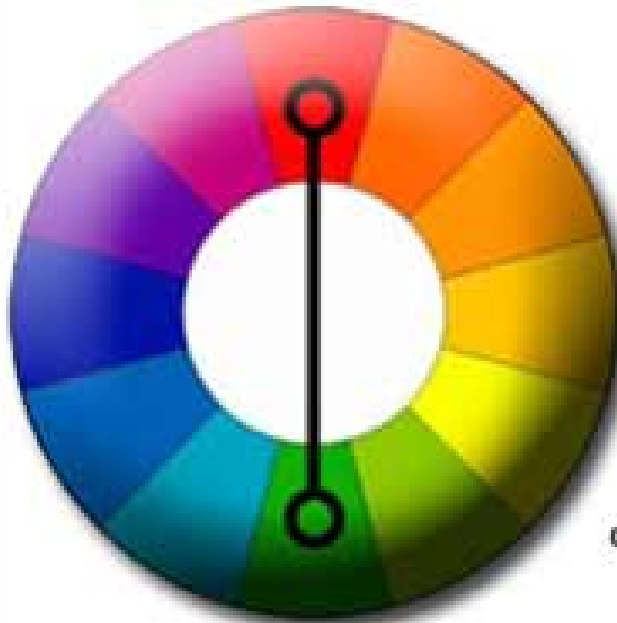
Now have a go at filling in your own colour wheel using whatever materials you have: pencil crayons, wax crayons, watercolours.



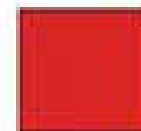


Primary Colours

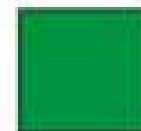
Complimentary Colours are diametrically opposite to each other in a colour wheel (as shown in the image)



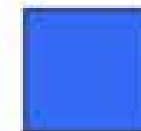
They are in maximum contrast to each other so each colour stands out very brightly against the other. They can be used to create a vibrant bold look



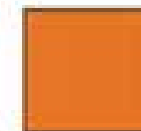
