

What is meant by mark making?


Mark making is where a variety of lines are used to give the impression of the texture of a surface.





Line:


 A line is a mark which can be heavy, light, scratchy, smooth, angular or curvy.



Texture:


 How The Surface Of Something Feels.

Mark making can be used to add detail on an object or a landscape:











You could use:

- 2. Use your cane and ink to create a range of marks. Explore how to build up shadow?









Vincent Scarpace

Here is an artist who has used patterns to create imaginative fish.








