We would very much like to wish Nia well, having decided to leave her post at Ormiston Ilkeston Enterprise Academy after seven years as Principal. She will not be returning in September. Nia has decided to continue her career closer to home, and to prioritise her health and family.

I know this will come as a surprise to lots of you, as Miss Salt has been an integral part of the academy for many years. It has not been an easy decision for her to make. I know you will all join me in wishing her the very best in her next steps.

I appreciate that you may have some concerns about the future leadership of the academy, and I am pleased to inform you that Simon Glover has been appointed as Interim Principal, starting from September. We are confident that he will do an excellent job in continuing to build on the strong foundations in place.

Simon will be closely supported by Rod Hughes, an Education Director at OAT. Rod is an experienced leader, having been a successful Principal in two OAT schools, and will be based at Ormiston Ilkeston Enterprise Academy two days a week for the coming term. Alongside Rod, Simon will have the support of the wider OAT team, as well the strong senior leadership team in place at Ormiston Ilkeston Enterprise Academy.

We will be working to appoint a permanent Principal for January 2023 following a robust recruitment process, and we will update you as soon as we have further information to share.

Mr Glover as new Principal will be in touch before the start of the new term. I also enclose a letter from Miss Salt, who wanted to write to you all directly in light of this news.

I hope that you all enjoy the summer holidays with your children, and we look forward to welcoming them all back in September.

By now you will have been made aware that I shall not be returning as Principal in September. It is with great sadness that I have decided to leave Ormiston Ilkeston Enterprise Academy after 7 years as Head and not a decision I've reached easily.
