
We are delighted to share updated Year 11 report information, collated by subject teachers after marking and verifying recent assessments.



## **Attendance Information**

Just 71 school days remain before the first GCSE exam when students return after Christmas, there is no factor that impacts grades more than attendance. Put simply, students with better attendance make greater progress and achieve higher grades than those who do not. Attendance must be greater than 95% for the rest of the school year in order to access prom.

(Obvious medical exemptions will be taken into consideration with a common-sense approach adopted when determining eligibility)

#### **Predicted Grades**

A predicted grade is the grade their teacher thinks they will currently receive if students continue to work as they are. Please note that these grades are not set in and stone and can increase with improved attendance, effort and revision, just as they can go down if students stop working hard. Predicted grades are informed by assessment performance in addition to homework completion and general classroom attitude.

The colours indicate students' attainment compared with their FFT50 target. This target is the average grade students are expected to achieve given their starting point, this is based on their Key Stage 2 SATS.

## **Attitude to Learning Judgement**

Attitude to learning encompasses all the classroom-based behaviours we see from your young person, including their completion of work, engagement in classroom discussion and behaviour within lessons. Students are assigned an attitude to learning judgement from Outstanding, Good, Requires Improvement, Poor.

### **Homework Completion Information**

Homework is a key element in supporting the improvement of outcomes for your young person, this is set weekly and linked to the retrieval of key knowledge that has been previously taught. Students are assigned a homework completion judgement from Outstanding, Satisfactory, Poor and no homework completed.

## What Next?

Students have completed practice exams in English Language, Maths and Science during this half term. Practise examinations for remaining subjects will take place during the second week back after Christmas. We are helping to prepare students through targeted morning prep sessions and will be utilising their afternoon CARE curriculum sessions to further improve their outcomes moving forward.

After School intervention is available every evening after school and it is expected that students attend most of these sessions. Those who do will achieve better grades than those who do not.

As always, we appreciate your support with everything discussed in this letter. This is a team effort, and it takes home and school, working together to secure the very best outcomes for our young people.
